This letter is submitted on the behalf of Mr. Thomas Anderson.


I have known Mr. Anderson on a professional basis for six years. Mr. Anderson, as a Representative in the Alaska State Legislature, sponsored and introduced legislation that I was and currently am working on as the chair of the Legislative Affairs Committee of the Alaska Society of Radiologic Technologists.

During the time that I worked on the legislation with Mr. Anderson, he never said anything or behaved in a manner that would cause me to doubt his character or integrity. He was always forthright and honest in his discussions with me and my colleagues.
